Tomiki moved to Manchuria to become an instructor at Daido Gakuin in March 1936 through an introduction provided by Ueshiba. He later became an instructor at KENKOKU UNIVERSITY in Manchuria, which opened in the spring of 1938 and headed the AIKI BUDO program, a regular part of the curriculum, with the assistance of Hideo OHBA.

Tomiki also intended for his kata to embody the principles of his aikido, but unlike in judo, where the study of kata usually comes after a practitioner is already familiar with the mechanics of a technique and has experience with randori, in Tomiki Aikido the randori no kata serves as the introduction to technique.

Tomiki Sensei believed that a "rationalization" of Aikido training, along the lines that Kano Sensei followed for Judo would make it more easily taught, particularly at the Japanese Universities. In addition, he believed that introducing an element of competition would serve to sharpen and focus the practice since it was no longer tested in real combat.

Introduction. Tomiki Sensei's major contribution to Aikido practice and thought was a curriculum modeled upon that of Judo. Tomiki Sensei died an 8th Dan in Judo, as well as an 8th Dan in Aikikai Aikido. Shodokan Aikido (田代 健二, Shōdōkan Aikidō) is the style of Aikido founded in 1967 by Kenji Tomiki (田代 健二 Tomiki Kenji, 1900–1979). Shodokan Aikido is sometimes referred to as 田代流 (Aikido Kyogi) meaning "Competitive Aikido" or "Sport Aikido" because of its use of regular competitions.

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
