The head of the MAIB, the Chief Inspector of Marine Accidents, reports directly to the Secretary of State for Transport. The Branch raised 1222 reports of marine accidents and incidents and commenced 22 investigations in 2019, compared with 1227 reports and 23 investigations started in 2018. Tragically, 13 investigations involved loss of life.

Marine accidents killed 1,163 people and caused \$197 million in insured losses in 2017. The deadliest maritime disaster occurred in January when a passenger ferry sank, killing 88 people off Nonouti, an atoll in Kiribati in the Pacific Ocean, between Papua New Guinea and Hawaii.
