Jean Piaget was born in 1896. His theory of cognitive development focuses on stages of growth and on a child's ability to acquire knowledge gradually. Piaget focused on intellectual development. He, too, believed that children develop because of their personal interactions. He believed children use "schemas" to acquire information.

Lev Vygotsky was another psychologist who believed children learn about their world through physical interaction. Vygotsky's sociocultural theory asserts that learning is an essentially social process in which the support of parents, caregivers, peers and the wider society and culture plays a crucial role in the development of higher psychological functions.

Child Development Theories: Lev Vygotsky

The maturationist theory considers development to be a natural biological process, so that a healthy child learns and develops naturally as he grows. The environmentalist theory states that a child's environment shapes his learning and behaviour by prompting certain reactions -- he is ready for kindergarten when he can respond appropriately to the rules and social setting of the classroom.

Theories about physical development in early childhood

Piaget's (1936) theory of cognitive development explains how a child constructs a mental model of the world. He disagreed with the idea that intelligence was a fixed trait, and regarded cognitive development as a process which occurs due to biological maturation and interaction with the environment.
