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### Conscious Sedation Guidelines Nurses

IN 1978, Bennett first described the clinical effects associated with I.V. conscious sedation and its impact on dental practice. Revised clinical practice guidelines have replaced the word conscious with moderate to address differences that occur within the continuum of sedation. The terms moderate sedation and procedural sedation are now used interchangeably.

### Nursing considerations for procedural sedation and ...

These guidelines specifically apply to the level of sedation corresponding to moderate sedation/analgesia (previously called conscious sedation), which is defined as a drug-induced depression of consciousness during which patients respond purposefully † to verbal commands, either alone or accompanied by light tactile stimulation. No interventions are required to maintain a patent airway when ...

### Practice Guidelines for Moderate Procedural Sedation and ...

National guidelines for administering conscious sedation should be consulted in establishing agency policies and procedures. The registered nurse administering agents to render conscious sedation would conduct a nursing assessment to determine that administration of the drug is in the patient's best interest.

### Conscious Sedation/Moderate Sedation

Moderate sedation/analgesia may be referred to as moderate sedation, conscious sedation, nurse-administered procedural sedation, nurse-administered propofol sedation, or procedural sedation and analgesia. The term moderate sedation/analgesia is used throughout this document in the recommendations and activities.

However, the administration of moderate sedation, deep sedation or general anaesthesia and the monitoring of the clients receiving this sedation are inappropriate for autonomous RPN practice. The College's position on sedation considers the complexity of care needed due to the potential for

rapid and unpredictable movement from one level of sedation to a deeper level.

### **ART Nursing considerations for procedural sedation and ...**

The American Association of Moderate Sedation Nurses (AAMSN) published a guideline in 2017 regarding the role of RNs in the administration and management of PSA and specified the need for an appropriately trained and competent nurse to monitor the patient continuously during the procedure under the supervision of a licensed provider/practitioner.
