The Early Childhood Development Kit (ECD Kit) was introduced in UNICEF programming in 2009 to strengthen the organization's humanitarian response for children of 0-6 years of age that are caught in emergencies. The kits are used to stimulate play and to foster a sense of stability and safety, and to provide children with learning materials.

In complement to basic services related to young children's hygiene and sanitation, health and nutrition, protection and education, the Kit offers young children access to play, stimulation and early learning opportunities and permits them to retrieve a sense of normalcy.

The center included UNICEF ECD Kits for Emergencies, which give parents, caregivers and teachers information and learning tools to nurture children's brains in crisis and low resource settings. Over the last decade, more than 7 million children have been reached with these kits, through 104 UNICEF Country Offices.

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In parallel, Plan International and UNICEF engaged with various ministries - forming an inter-ministerial ECD committee - and agreed to collaborate to provide multi-sectoral ECD services for children aged 0-6 years.
