Blues music started to become available to the public in 1895 with the first recorded blues song. It was “Laughing Song” which was recorded by George W. Johnson. Although this was an important mark in the blue’s history, the real recording that opened up many doors for the rising demand for this genre of music was in 1920 when Mamie Smith recorded “Crazy Blues” and “It’s Right Here for You.”

At the time, rhythm and blues was basically a code phrase for “music recorded and bought by black people.” Inevitably, the next generation of black performers, like Bo Diddley, Little Richard, and Ray Charles, began taking their cues from R&B—which led to the next major chapter in the history of the blues.

The History and Cultural Impact of the Blues

The blues form was first popularized about 1911-14 by the black composer W.C. Handy (1873-1958). However, the poetic and musical form of the blues first crystallized around 1910 and gained popularity through the publication of Handy’s “Memphis Blues” (1912) and “St. Louis Blues” (1914).
