MEDICARE PART B Premium - 2018 Medicare Costs The 2018 Medicare costs for the monthly Part B premium is \$134, but it can be higher depending on your income (see IRMAA below). If you are already collecting Social Security benefits, the premium may be less; on average \$130.

Other Medicare costs. Other Medicare Part A and Part B costs in 2018 include the following: The annual Medicare Part B deductible for Original Medicare will be \$183, the same as in 2017. The monthly Medicare Part A (hospital insurance) premium for those who need to buy coverage will cost up to \$422, up from \$413 in 2017.

In contrast, many of the costs for medical care coverage under Medicare Part B will stay the same in 2018. For instance, the annual deductible for 2018 remains at \$183 per year, which represents the amount you have to pay for doctor visits or other outpatient services before Part B coverage kicks in.

In 2017, Medicare beneficiaries had to meet a \$1,316 deductible for each benefit period before Medicare Part A started paying its share of the costs. In 2018, the Medicare Part A deductible has increased to \$1,340 per benefit period. Part A Coinsurance
