Strategies for Reading Comprehension #2: Think Alouds (During Read Alouds) Modeling is a great way to demonstrate reading with comprehension. When you are reading aloud any text to your students (story, article, directions, etc.), model what goes on in your head as you think about what you read.

Reading Content Area Think-Pair-Share could be used very easily in the content area of reading. For example, if students are reading a novel, the teacher could use this strategy to prompt discussion and gather ideas such as the main idea of the story,

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conflict, resolution, etc.

Think-Pair-Share - Teaching Reading Comprehension Strategies

Think-alouds have been described as "eavesdropping on someone's thinking." With this strategy, teachers verbalize aloud while reading a selection orally. Their verbalizations include describing things they're doing as they read to monitor their comprehension. The purpose of the think-aloud strategy is to model for students how skilled readers construct meaning from a text.

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To illustrate, the Test of Reading Comprehension Fourth Edition (TORC-4) assesses untimed reading comprehension abilities primarily via multiple-choice questions of reduced complexity. This allows for score over inflation as even poor readers have the opportunity to guess the correct answers 25% of the time.
