Surgery May Not Be Best in Elderly Patients with Nonfatal Skin Cancer Cancer Connect Although skin cancer is often treated with surgery, older patients with a limited life expectancy may not benefit from this treatment approach because they may endure complications and not live long enough to benefit from the treatment, according to the results of a study published in JAMA Internal Medicine .

Therefore, skin self-monitoring (TABLE 1) and skin surveillance by a trained clinician are integral components of skin cancer identification and prevention. These monitoring measures are considered health care imperatives because skin cancers must be treated early and proper diagnosis of unusual skin growths should always be made definitively and without undue delay.

Common Benign Skin Growths in Older Adults

Skin cancer is a worldwide, emerging clinical need in the elderly white population, with a steady increase in incidence rates, morbidity and related medical costs. Skin cancer is a heterogeneous group of cancers comprising cutaneous melanoma and non-melanoma skin cancers (NMSC), which predominantly affect elderly patients, aged older than 65 years.

Skin cancer (squamous cell) can develop in these areas, so examination by a doctor is recommended. Bowen's disease - a type of slow-growing and scaly skin patch thought to be caused by the sun.
